<u>Furthermore</u>, the following rules shall be observed while appointing Arbitrators in statutory arbitration references

- For cases involving a disputed amount of <u>up to ₹10 lakhs</u>, the arbitrator must have a minimum of <u>3 years</u> of standing at the Bar as an Advocate or be a retired Judicial Officer/Govt. Servant on Judicial/Administrative side.
- For cases involving a disputed amount of <u>above ₹10 lakhs and up to ₹25 lakhs</u>, the arbitrator must have a minimum of <u>5 years</u> of standing at the Bar as an Advocate or be a retired Judicial Officer/Govt. Servant on Judicial/Administrative side. Additionally, the arbitrator should have experience in at least <u>10 arbitration</u> matters, either serving as an arbitrator or representing parties as counsel.
- 3. For cases involving a disputed amount of <u>above ₹25 lakhs and up to ₹50 lakhs</u>, the arbitrator must have a minimum of <u>7 years</u> of standing at the Bar as an Advocate or be a retired Judicial Officer/Govt. Servant on Judicial/Administrative side. Additionally, the arbitrator should have experience in at least <u>15 arbitration</u> <u>matters</u>, either serving as an arbitrator or representing parties as counsel.
- 4. For cases involving a disputed amount of ₹50 lakhs and above, the arbitrator must have a minimum of 10 years of standing at the Bar as an Advocate or be a retired Judicial Officer/Govt. Servant on Judicial/Administrative side. Additionally, the arbitrator should have experience in at least 25 arbitration matters, either serving as an arbitrator or representing parties as counsel.

<u>Note</u>: While calculating Exp. in Arb. matters, cases handled for Banks/NBFCs shall not be taken into account.
